Jock White Field Days

This year we had a very good turn out of members to man the club's phone only station. All told there were six members who operated. The threatened bad weather did not eventuate. A heavy shower just before dawn on Sunday 24 February simply encouraged the crew to hurry up their job of refilling the generator with petrol, and adding some more oil.

The team comprised Gary ZL1WGL, Mike ZL1UOM, Tom ZL1TO, Durlene ZL1ULK, Ian ZL1PZ and Peter ZL1PJH. Now that Ian has shifted to the Possum Bourne Village he finds that it is impossible to operate an HF home station, so that will have created an opportunity for a new station to take over top spot among home stations.

The antennas were slung from masts that utilized the resources of the market garden that surrounded us. A fork lift was used to assemble the 80 m pole, and the 40 m pole was anchored to a sturdy trailer that carries a water tank for irrigation purposes.

Our score improved on 80 m where we found 27 multipliers (compared with 22 last year), but conditions on 40 m meant that we never made contact with some of the closer, northern clubs, earning us 15 multipliers (compared with 22 last year).

The Bombay Fun Run is organised by the Bombay Lions Club to celebrate the arrival on 18 March 1865 of the ship "Bombay" from England. The "Bombay" was towed into Auckland by the warship "Curacao", having lost a large portion of her masts and rigging in a terrible storm off the coast of New Zealand. There were 400 assisted immigrants on board destined for the area now called Bombay where they were to settle on their promised 10 acre allotments.

To reach their new home they travelled along the Gt South Rd from Drury to Bombay, a road that had just been completed by the army. The 10 km and half marathon course is along the path they would have travelled. The 5 km takes in part of the road but trails around a picturesque rural road taking in another area of Bombay.

Klondyke Repeater site

At the February general meeting Ted ZL1BQA reported that he had a phone call regarding power at Klondyke site. It was thought the problem might have been the underground cable from the roadside to the tower. After tracing the cable it was found that a Counties Power HT fuse was playing up. The aerial photograph that Ian ZL1PZ made has been mislaid.

March issue of Spectrum reported thus: Power failed at Klondyke about 11 am on Monday 11th February and the fault was reported to Counties Power. They responded with standby generators by mid-afternoon at the Team Talk/Police site and the VHF Group repeater site. The Klondyke hut was left with the door unlocked to allow entry of the cable. The batteries recovered to 13.7V. They suspected a fault with the underground cables.

Inquiries with the forestry manager found that there were no logging contractors working in the area at the time. By Wednesday the fault had not been identified. Counties Power decided to replace the pole transformer beside the Klondyke gate. It was completed on Wednesday afternoon but there was still a problem with underground power cables. It was decided to walk the cable route on Thursday to see if there was any sign of disturbance. One phase goes to Klondyke and the second phase goes to the Team Talk/Police.

Compass has incurred expenses and will be seeking to recover them. It also appeared that the National System link south transmitter may be intermittent. A visit to the site on Thursday showed that there was no disturbance to the surface along the line of the cable trench. Intermittent power at the repeater site was found to be due to fuse failures on the 11 kV side of the pole transformer rather than the 230 V side. Counties Power found there was leakage on the phase going from Klondyke to the Team Talk/Police building and disconnected it with the work-around being a new cable laid on the surface from the Klondyke hut in the interim. A permanent arrangement has not yet been agreed.

Fire next door

Well, it was bound to happen, and so it did in the early afternoon of Thursday 28 February.

Shortly before 1 pm your Editor had a phone call from a member to say "That alarm is for a fire at 19 Stadium Drive. Is that the address of our clubhouse?"

The plume of white smoke was well visible over the King Street shops as I drove to the scene.

Three fire appliances and many fire and police personnel turned up and Stadium Drive was cordoned off from Franklin Road to East Street.

Heaps of high school age children were near the skate park. It looks as though they had the afternoon off. A 14 year old looks to be taking the blame for the fire.

The heat from the burning Pukekohe Performing Arts' garage and the costumes inside was so intense it set fire to the trees behind. The fence was also charred in places. However the main building, called "Old Vic" was saved.

At 3 pm there was a meeting with 3 from PPA, 2 from Council and 2 from FARC in our clubhouse. Decisions were made to put a temporary security fence around the two PPA buildings and demolition of the garage will be necessary.

A demolition contractor was on site 11 and 12 March. His



crew have collapsed the building and put the remains in a skip.

As yet the mooted CCTV camera has not been installed. And it seems that the rumour that the skate park will be enlarged when "those ugly buildings go" has not been put to bed by Council. Another rumour is that the "Old Vic" is to go and a car park will replace it. Our information, from Council Officers is that there are other community organizations waiting to move in.
