Reports:

AREC: The Auckland regional meeting set down for Thursday 17 February has been cancelled. Jason advised that he has been a coastguard volunteer, with radio operating experience, and has an interest in the AREC side of radio activity.

Vandalism: Graffiti on the front of the clubhouse was reported in an email from Jason ZL2UJK. The words had been erased (with solvent?) by someone unknown before 9 February 2022. The outside water tap was noticed to be missing 9 February. investigation by Gary ZL1WGL and Mike ZL1UOM found the remaining copper water pipes beneath the clubhouse have been removed. These two members have reconnected the water with polybutyl pipe. Mike noticed wire hanging below the floor and discovered all the power points in the main room are dead. Gary reported the burglary, online, to Police on the evening of Monday 13th. Tom has reported graffiti on the wall facing Carl's Junior to Police earlier today. There may have been a visit by a forensic investigator this afternoon.

General Business:

Remit. Bob spoke on a proposed Franklin Branch remit to NZART.

When a radio amateur becomes a silent key or moves overseas permanently and never intends to use the NZ call sign again, the branch committee (usually the secretary or president but not necessarily so) contacts the call sign holders next of kin and advises them of the procedure on how to have the call sign deleted.

Explanation: There are hundreds, possibly thousands, of call signs listed to deceased persons. This will enable the call book to be more up to date. The next of kin should be given page 32 (or a copy) of the 2019 call book.

Barry ZL1ABR reported that Barry ZL1AAA is a recent silent key. The current procedure provides that if family member wants the call then they can request RSM to hold the call for a period of a year or so.

Discussion ensued. The topic will be brought up again at our next meeting.

Operating procedures and etiquette

(Copied from Radio Society of Great Britain website. It never hurts to remind ourselves of the basics. Plus, there is an interesting idea in the tail of this piece - Ed)

When you are new to amateur radio there is a lot to learn and the more you listen, the more you will find out the correct way to proceed on the bands.

Perhaps one of the most important lessons to learn is listen first before talking. And better still, before calling CQ ask: "Is this frequency in use please?"

Often a frequency is in use, but you can't hear the other station. There is nothing more infuriating than being in a QSO with someone and having the conversation utterly ruined by someone calling CQ on top of you.

The Radio Amateur is:

Considerate

They never knowingly operates in such a way as to lessen the pleasure of others.

The International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) has actually published a document

called Ethics and Operating Procedures for the Radio Amateur.

You can download your own copy – it is worth reading.

Loval

They offer loyalty, encouragement and support to other amateurs, local clubs, the IARU Radio Society in their country, through which Amateur Radio in their country is represented nationally and internationally.

Progressive

They keeps their station up to date. It is well-built and efficient. Their operating practice is above reproach.

Friendly

They operate slowly and patiently when requested; offer friendly advice and counsel to the beginner; kind assistance, cooperation and consideration for the interests of others. These are the marks of the amateur spirit.

Balanced

Radio is a hobby, never interfering with duties owed to family, job, school or community.

Patriotic

Their station and skills are always ready for service to country and community.

The rest of the document is too long to reproduce here, but it is worth highlighting a few of the other guidelines:

- During your on-the-air contacts, use the Q-code correctly. Avoid using the Q-code all the time when using phone. Use standard expressions that everybody understands.
- Listen a good radio amateur starts by listening a lot.
- Use your callsign correctly
- Always be courteous

Another way of being courteous is to try to contact other stations using their own language? You only need about 100 words and callsign phonetics in other languages.

Many foreign stations are reluctant to take calls in English because they speak it so poorly. Others will keep the QSO very short as they cannot understand what you are saying. Being able to give the other station their report, your name and QTH, and perhaps a greeting in their own language, can make a big difference.

Whatever you do, just remember that on the airwaves you are an ambassador for the hobby - and for your country. Please act accordingly.
