The BITX40 transceiver

At the October general meeting Ted ZL1BQA gave a presentation and demonstration of the 40 m version of this innovative transceiver which is available in kit form.

While the kit, when assembled, performs satisfactorily, there is plenty of scope to build add-ons to make improvements. The design is intended to be used as a learning tool for home constructors who may easily modify and improve the circuit and its Arduino microprocessor. Ted had built an anti thump circuit and is looking at adding automatic gain control.
