Remote control of HF transceivers

Members were treated by an informative and fast paced presentation at the August meeting.

Two approaches to solving the problem of remote control were explored. Our neighbours in Papakura are looking to establish a club remote station using one of these methods.

The Hardware solution

Nigel ZL2SEA (below) has a quiet location in the far north, with HF G5RV antennas for 160 m, 80 m and 40 m slung from mature pine trees in a plantation that has been thinned. The remote transmitter is a Yaesu FT857. The FT857 has a detachable front panel. Yaesu have a box that connects the radio end and the detached front panel at the remote end. No additional computer is required.

Franklin Positive Ageing, Friday 28 September



Members are invited to bring transceivers to be tested on Marconi test gear.


Yaesu FT-857

Conditions are somewhat better at the Papakura Radio Club site on the Great South Road. ICOM radios are well suited to the RS-BA1 software.

The software solution is less expensive than hardware. An advantage for a club station is that a single software licence can cover the use of one transceiver by a larger number of remote stations. Again, both ends need an internet connection.

On Sunday 9 September the South Auckland Car Club was host to the final round of the ABC Pipe Fitters series along logging roads in the Maramarua forest. There were 49 entries.

David Karrasch ZL1DK from Papakura Radio Club recruited the operators to provide safety communications. In all eight stations were involved; four from Papakura and four from Franklin.

The course ran for around 6 kilometers along Ridge Road from near its junction with Okaeria Road then down Quarry Road to end near the forest headquarters. Much of Ridge Road has been recently milled, so there was an open landscape to make judging the curves a lot easier.

The day got off to a slow start with the forest gate being locked and causing participants to queue for what seemed ages. The first batch of operators had arrived by 7.30 am.






Bob ZL1BBZ and Tom ZL1TO set up the 6825 repeater at a high point on the junction of Ridge and Quarry Roads. With a fresh breeze it was considered prudent to set the radiating element above a minimum of poles. The repeater, with its new Panasonic 100 Ah valve regulated battery performed faultlessly.

In addition to Start (ZL1TO) and Finish (ZL1ULK) we had operators at Point B (ZL1BBZ) and Point C (ZL1PZ). Papakura manned Point A, two mobile stations and Base.

The first run started at 11 am and the final, after four stages was complete by 4.30 pm. There were one or two "offs" but no major incidents.
