Among the agencies involved were Coastguard, Surf Life Saving, LandSAR and AREC. The new rescue helicopters may also have put in an appearance.

Listeners may have come across radio traffic relating to the exercise on the VHF frequencies EE122 163.725 MHz (LandSAR repeater), and MM 06 156.300 MHz (Ship to Ship)

Control started off manually then introduced the computer system SARTrack. Marine Rescue Centre was headquarters, with Operations based at Onehunga Wharf.

POSH FROCK SHOP

Posh Frock Shop designer – Ian Stuart

From 2002, I owned and operated a small computer network business in South London. Our customers were primary schools. Tony Blair's government had recently installed networks in most primary schools but there were few people who could show teachers how to use them. As a teacher myself, I was in a good position to help.



Park Hall Industrial Estate – West Norwood

At first, we ran the business from a desk at the far end of our bedroom. I did the computer stuff and my wife Josephine did the accounts. However, Josephine understandably became tired of such a small office and organised the rental of an industrial unit in Park Hall Industrial estate in West Norwood.

After a few months, a young well-dressed man appeared at our office doorway. He had seen a new list of companies at the foyer downstairs and noticed we did computer networks. Would we come and have a look at his computer network? He was having trouble getting his server to perform. He announced his name was Peter Tague and together with his partner Ian Stuart he designed and sold wedding dresses.

From a staff of three, Pete and Ian expanded quickly. Within a year they had eight staff and got themselves into a larger unit. At first I adapted their small server to the work load, but it was quickly apparent they needed a lot more infra-structure. When they moved to a third even larger unit, I laid Cat 5 cables within the overhead channelling, installed by builders so up to 30 workstations and two servers could be brought into action as staff numbers expanded. There was also a wedding 'set' with mirrors and columns for customers built alongside the office area. Often when I worked on server issues there were young brides walking about the office trying on beautifully crafted gowns.

In 2013 Pete and Ian decided to open a flagship outlet in Blewcoat in Westminster. This is an historic school building on Buckingham Gate near the palace. The whole building was re-modelled to best capture the glam and splendour of a wedding ceremony. My role was to make sure the computers at Blewcoat became integrated with servers back in West Norwood – which I accomplished with VPN (virtual private network) connections. In effect, staff could log on at either building and see the same shared folders and database.

This year, Pete and Ian have gone even more global with Posh Frock Shop, a fly on the wall reality TV show. Ian fronts the show, getting various nuptial persons - brides, mothers, brothers, sisters, children, aunts and others

Pete and Ian are genuine, friendly people. When I first saw the show a few weeks ago, I contacted them to ask how things were going. Pete answered, "How are you both, are you enjoying the retirement? I would love to visit NZ and have many friends who live there, but I've only got as far as Sydney so far...

We hope you're enjoying the show, it was a lot of hard work where we virtually closed the shop for the whole filming period."

After twenty years in the UK, Josephine and I sold the network business and returned to New Zealand two years ago. We try to keep in touch with our London contacts even though the time zone is against us. Strangely, Peter and Ian have overcome the time zone barrier by appearing on our television set each week as live and as engaging as they ever were when we were there.

likely source of the digital signal. The difference was one dit in the morse code identifier that follows the data stream. Three days later the data transmission was shifted down frequency by 4 kHz. And shortly after that I received an audio recording in mp3 format. My ears do not stand a show of verifying that the morse is not ZL1SA, but you can see below that an online spectrogram program can do the job. The screen grab below has been edited to protect the privacy of individuals. [Editor]
